EL CAMINO COLLEGE PROGRAM FAQ'S

What is the Propel L.A. Short-Term Workforce Training Program?

- The Propel L.A. Short-Term Workforce Training Program is a **free 8-week program**, particularly suitable for clients of non-profit and community-based organizations that serve the following populations:
 - Underemployed
 - Formerly incarcerated
 - Disconnected youth (ages 18-24)
 - Clients not in government-funded programs like GAIN, GROW, etc.

Where will these programs take place?

- The Propel L.A. Short-Term Workforce Training Program will take place at El Camino College to serve the West Los Angeles and South Bay regions of L.A. County.

What will participants learn & experience?

- Participants will be matched into 8-week workforce training programs in areas such as machine tooling, construction technology, welding, and automotive to learn the necessary job-specific training & soft skills to access positions with high career and wage growth potential in local industries such as aerospace, advanced manufacturing, and construction.

What is the cost?

- Program participants will have their full course tuition and fees paid, if they are referred by a non-profit or community-based organization.

What additional support will be provided to program participants?

- Program participant will have access to support services, such as transportation and food assistance, counseling services, tutoring, as well as job readiness, and soft-skills training including communication, time management, team work, and resume writing, among other topics.

What happens after the program completion?

- Participants who successfully complete the short-term program will be guaranteed job interviews in leading local companies in the West Los Angeles and South Bay regions.

What if my agency's clients say that they don't plan to "go to college?"

- Let them know that this is only an 8-week program.
- The instructors and staff at El Camino College work with program participants just like them all the time.
- El Camino staff's goal is to help your clients be successful and will provide lots of extra assistance and support to help them finish.

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How non-profit and community-based organizations can get involved?
